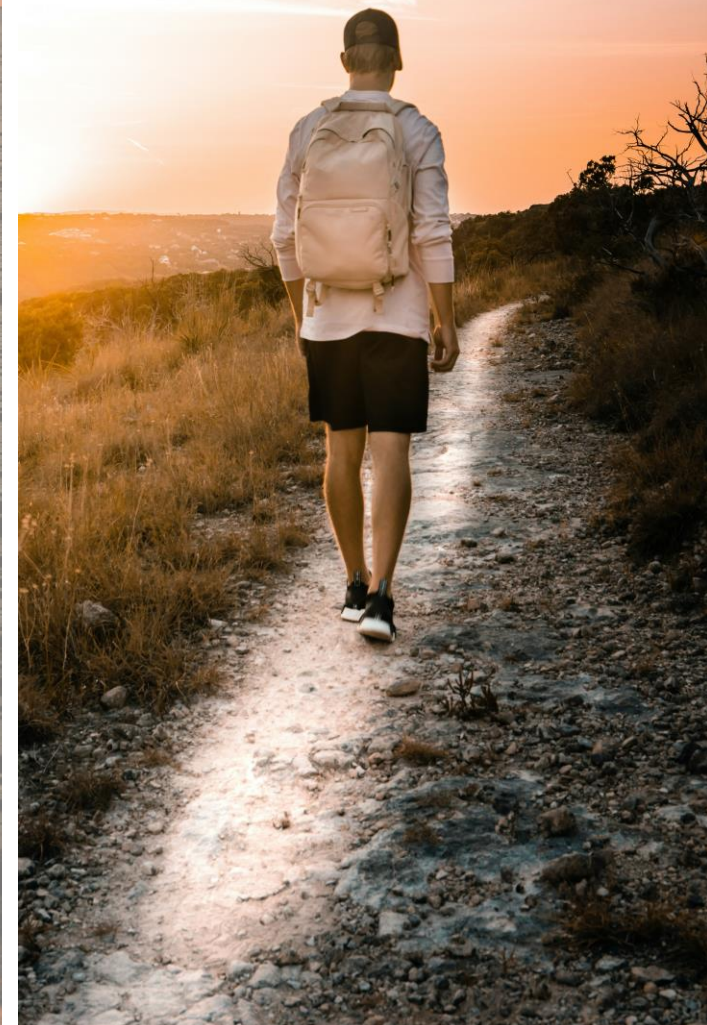

The New Creation

As God's children, we are new creatures in Christ Jesus.

Romans 1:16 declares the incredible truth that the gospel is the very power of God, extending its transformative influence on all who embrace it with faith. As Christians, our belief in Jesus Christ ignites within us the dynamic force of God's Word, empowering us to live out the life that Christ sacrificed for us to inherit. This divine power, flowing through the Word of God, shapes us into individuals capable of walking in alignment with God's purpose on Earth.

It is not a matter of adhering to the dictates of various denominational teachings; rather, it is the supernatural work of God within us, facilitated by the Holy Spirit, that enables us to transition from relying on our own strength to harnessing the power of God dwelling within us.

We are made up of three parts: the Bible tells us we are a spirit, possess a soul, and reside in a physical body. This concept is mentioned in 1 Thessalonians 5:23

When we accept Jesus Christ, God recreates our spirits in His image, as outlined in 2 Corinthians 5:17. We

become new creatures, born again through the Holy Spirit. The part of us that is born again is our spirit. Our spirit was in the nature of sin and in the nature of a fallen man that came through Adam; God recreates our spirit through the Holy Spirit and makes us new creatures in Christ Jesus.

This recreation isn't based on our works but on the redemptive work of Christ. Consequently, our acceptance by God isn't earned through good deeds but received through faith in Jesus.

As new creatures, our spirits are Heaven-ready, but the transformation doesn't end there. Our souls—the realm of thoughts, emotions, and willpower—require renewal to align with our recreated spirits. Ephesians 4:23-24 exhorts us to renew our minds and put on the new self, created in righteousness and true holiness. This process involves immersing ourselves in God's Word, allowing our subconscious minds to be renewed. In so doing, we are transformed into the image of Christ.

True holiness and righteousness are not attained through self-effort or religious rituals but become the very nature of our recreated spirit.

In 2 Peter 1:4, the Bible says that as we meditate on God's promises, His divine nature becomes our own, enabling us to manifest the fruits of the Spirit in our daily lives. This transformation empowers us to walk as sons of God in love, joy, peace, power, authority, and much more. These precious promises are given to us in the Bible. As we meditate and think on these promises, the very nature of God becomes our nature. That means we become partakers of His divine nature, and that helps us to walk as sons of God on this Earth while we are looking for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Therefore, as believers, our acceptance by God is not contingent upon our efforts or our commitments to the religious traditions of men; instead, it is rooted in our faith in Jesus Christ and the work He accomplished on the cross. By embracing Him as our Savior and Lord, we are born anew into the family of God, endowed with the privilege of experiencing His grace and participating in His divine nature. This new life, characterized by grace and powered by the Holy Spirit, is our inheritance as children of God, attainable solely through faith in Jesus Christ.
